

From Your Worship Pastor:

New Hymn!

Pastor Wade and I have been talking about his new sermon series beginning on January 8 titled, "Be Strong and Courageous." This series focuses on the story of Joshua and how his story can impact us as followers of Jesus. I believe that all of us can attest to the need for God's courage and strength in today's post-modern culture. That's where worship can play a big part in that goal. When we authentically connect with God and His revealed attributes, our need for God's touch can be strengthened. As we learn together from Joshua, I'd like for us all to learn a new hymn that's been written in the last few years that will strengthen this connection with God and his purposes for us. When our days are darkest and our strength wanes, imagine singing these lyrics together:

> The night is dark, but I am not forsaken For by my side, the Savior He will stay I labor on in weakness and rejoicing For in my need, His power is displayed

To this I hold, my Shepherd will defend me Through the deepest valley He will lead Oh the night has been won, and I shall overcome Yet not I, but through Christ in me ("Yet Not I But Through Christ I n Me," 2018 CityAlight Music)

There are other verses, of course, and they are all significant. I can even see eventually where this song might be requested at funerals because it brings the whole human experience full circle – from the beginning of salvation to finishing this race here on earth.

So can we learn this together?! I am fully aware that no one can make anyone listen to music, but I am making this specific request of you – our multi-generational MFB family. Worship is powerful because we do it . . . together. We affirm God together, we lament our struggles together. What if our worship services in January with filled with people who came knowing this song? Maybe it could be our January theme song!? (of a sort . . .) It is a new hymn that has impacted many throughout the body of Christ, including many SBC churches. It's not hard to sing at all and it is a joy to sing!

So at this point, you might ask . . . how? (you may even be saying, "please don't send me to Spotify – I can't figure it out!") No – this won't be a Spotify suggestion – trust me! Several of you have mentioned during this past year that we "don't know the new songs."

So, here's your chance to learn this new hymn during our Joshua series in January.

So to share this new song, our own Tom Adams has reduced all the barriers to any 3rd party app or website and created a custom tool just for the family of MFB! I couldn't be more excited about this! It's a labor of love on Tom's part and super easy! All you have to do is click on the link (once it's included in an email for the entire church) and when you click on this link there will be a list of songs where each individual song has "play, rewind, forward" icons. You simply select the play icon for the song you want – that's it!

The link will be coming but it's not included just yet! (Wait for the churchwide email in a week or two)

Let's do this together! Let's take the "listen to it once a day" challenge beginning January 2nd. It will be enriching, and significant enough to use as a supplement to any daily devotion.
