From Your Worship Pastor:

Some Practical Suggestions for Our 1 Service in July & August

We all know what it's like to be a guest at a different church or a participant in a conference where we don't "know the songs." Without a doubt – that is frustrating! Rest assured; unfamiliarity is not confined to only newer worship songs – it can also apply to hymns as well. As we continue on our trial run of combining services into one service, there may be some short-term hurdles of not knowing "that song" used in our worship. (This is to be expected and there is a solution that I will share at the end of this article!) While not knowing "that song" can be frustrating, it doesn't have to stay frustrating. Some realization and reminders might be helpful to move past this frustration:

Realization #1: All songs in our hymnal at one point in their history where "new." Then congregations learned them and used them and they became an integral part of people's faith journey. Our hymns are evidence of that – and new songs as well as older hymns can be learned by all generations.

Realization #2: Many songs in our rotation have some great scriptural insights to connect our worship with God. "Abide" articulates our submission and humility beautifully with "I depend on You" while addressing God directly with his attributes: "You're the way, the truth and the life – You're the well that never runs dry – I am the branch and You are the vine; draw me close and teach me to abide." "Behold the Lamb" narrates the gospel story with "the story written on His hands," while direct scripture is quoted with "The Blessing" (Numbers 6:24-25) and "Act Justly, Love Mercy, Walk Humbly" (Micah 6:8). Regardless of the selected song in worship, it will have a significant scriptural connection – it will not be "fluff."

Finally, our aim is to take the best of our familiar hymns and the best of the new worship songs that facilitate all of our generations gathering for worship. Let's put the focus on Christ – the object of our worship and "raise our gaze" to Him!


From Your Senior Adult Pastor:
